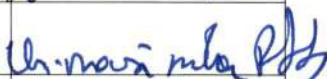
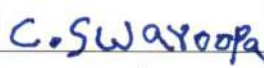
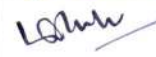
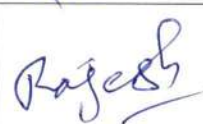
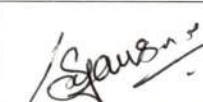
MINUTES OF THE 16TH GOVERNING BODY MEETING

ITEM 1: PRESENTATION OF THE ANNUAL REPORT

1.1 IMPLEMENTATION OF PREVIOUS DECISIONS

Additionally, an in-depth analysis of research and development undertakings, consultancy projects, internship placements, financial initiatives, and a comprehensive outline of extracurricular activities, including NSS, YRC, NCC, and sports, was provided.

The resolutions effectuated from the preceding Governing Body meeting, conducted on **January 27, 2024**, were validated and approved.

ITEM 2: REVIEW OF ACCREDITATION AND APPROVAL PROCESS

Resolution:

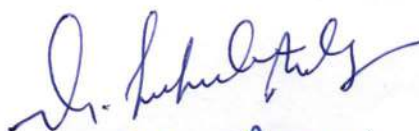
- CMR Engineering College shall submit an *Extension of Approval (EOA)* application for AY 2025–26 as per AICTE APH 2024–27 guidelines.

ITEM No. 6: REVIEW OF EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES AND ACHIEVEMENTS

Resolution:

The Committee duly acknowledged and commended the commendable accomplishments of students in the domains of sports and cultural pursuits. Their exceptional performances were recognized with appropriate accolades and incentives.

Furthermore, the Committee sanctioned full financial sponsorship for students participating in outstation events, with the requisite budgetary provisions being considered for formal approval.

ITEM No. 7: REVIEW OF RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT

The Committee conducted a meticulous assessment of ongoing research initiatives, prevailing R&D policies, and proposed modifications to incentive structures.

Key Highlights:

- The institution actively promotes research endeavors by incentivizing faculty to publish their scholarly work in reputed conferences and indexed journals. Notably, the number of SCOPUS/SCI/WOS publications witnessed a significant surge from **245 to 545** during the academic year 2023–24, with an additional **38 papers** awaiting publication.
- A total of **28 faculty members** have successfully enrolled in Ph.D. programs at esteemed institutions, including premier NITs and government universities.
- **16 doctoral degrees** were successfully conferred upon faculty members during the academic year.

Resolution:

Students pursuing a **full-time Ph.D.** under CMREC through the JNTUH Research Center shall be eligible for financial fellowships, reinforcing the institution's commitment to fostering advanced research.

ITEM No. 8: REVIEW OF PLACEMENT AND TRAINING STRATEGIES AND EDC ACTIVITIES

Resolution:

In view of the Teaching-Learning Process (TLP), Entrepreneurship Development Cell (EDC), and Internship Programs, the following resolutions were adopted:
